

Bread Identification (ID)

Improve your breed identification knowledge

Synopsis

This course is intended to provide learners (e.g. animal welfare officers/rangers, animal attendants, council pound workers) with basic knowledge and skills to assist in the correct identification of dog and cat breeds, in order to record breed information correctly when reporting on incidents and to help educate breed owners.

With over 200 dog breeds and over 50 cat breeds in Australia, and with numbers increasing, it is essential those working with cats and dogs remain up to date with new breed information.
